Revision Sheet for Yearly Exam 2010

Topics for Revision:

- Treaty of Versailles and the policy of Appeasement;
- Hitler's Germany (Laws passed, restrictions imposed);
- The Jews (treatment of Jews from 1933 up to the Final Solution);
- Our visit to the Sydney Jewish Museum;
- The causes of World War Two;
- Australian involvement in North Africa and the Pacific;
- Japanese advance in the Pacific – Pearl Harbour, Bombing of Darwin, Fall of Singapore;
- Australian prisoners-of-war of the Japanese; and,
- Aspects of the home front that your class has covered (eg, bombing of Darwin, midget submarines in Sydney Harbour, women's involvement, restrictions at home, rationing).

Make sure you know all the factual content, and definitions to do with these topics. The information in your text and class notes will assist your revision. The Term 3 Assessment Task on the Sydney Jewish Museum and the current task based on an Australian battle in WW2 will both be examined.

Exam format:

Time: 90 minutes

Part A: 20 Multiple Choice. Examining all semester two content.

Part B: **Written responses.** These are longer answers, of about one page each. There will be some choice, and two questions have to be answered.

Part C: **Sources.** The questions on the sources will move from simple comprehension to interpretation and analysis. Your answers to this section must be written in **sentence form**. You will lose marks if your answers are not in sentence form.

Part D: **Essay.** The essay topic will examine your knowledge and understanding of a WW2 Battlefront in which Australia was involved. You should be able to provide details of how, when, where and why Australians fought, and what was the outcome.
